Annual Director Report - Mobility

Description of Committee:

The Mobility Committee provides members of MLCA with a venue to address their concerns around mobility issues including roads, parking, speed, speed bumps, crosswalks. The Committee also engages the city on mobility concerns and will proactively make recommendations for improvements in safety and accessibility. The mobility Committee works closely with the Planning and Development Committee on development permit review and effects on mobility.

Achievements:

- Answering emails from residents about areas of concern and working with them to come to a solution. Areas included 42nd Avenue, 15th Street, 21 st SW, 20 st SW, 22nd st SW, Flanders Avenue, Amiens Road, Mons Ave, Garrison Boulevard, Ypres Green SW, Vimy Way SW and 29th Ave SW
- Conduct monthly meetings with Councillor Walcott's office about mobility concerns. We talk about all the hot spots and brainstorm ways to address them.
- Increasing the mobility committee from 0 to 4 MLCA Members to further support the MLCA. Met regularly online and on email to discuss areas of concern for mobility.
- Put out 7 new slow down signs in Garrison Woods and Altadore area
- Volunteered the pancake breakfast and spoke to residents about mobility concerns.
- Organized a community meeting in June 2024 with the Lycee and the Ypres Garrison Traffic Committee with 27 people in attendance. Continue to follow up with the school and the residents to ensure a safe solution.
- Met 4 times with Masters Academy and College to come to a solution on Flanders Avenue and Amiens
- Communicated regularly with Constable Art Szabo, the Community Resource officer with the Calgary Police. He attended an MLCA board meeting and the community meeting with the Lycee.
- Communicate with the Main Streets team of the City of Calgary and regularly bring up areas
 of concern.
- Regular monthly or bi-monthly written mobility updates in the Source newsletter.
 Committee members wrote about back-to-school safety, Main Streets updates including the new parking lot



- Fill out 311 requests regularly and communicate with Calgary parking authority on areas of concern especially around schools
- Organized a key meeting with the City of Calgary's mobility department
- Organized a successful Jane's Walk with the Marda Loop BIA, a local historian and the Military Museum. 67 people in attendance

Looking Ahead:

Continue to advocate for safe accessible streets in the Marda Loop Communities area:

- Continue to respond to residents and members about their concerns, offer help in solving the problem with the appropriate City department and providing signage
- Communicate with the Marda Loop Communities board about mobility issues
- Work with the Mobility Committee to ensure we are meeting the needs of the membership
- Volunteer with the MLCA at the Fun Casino, the Stampede Breakfast, Marda Gras and any other events
- Communicate with the public using social media and a map on the MLCA web site
- Organize a spring walk/book launch about Calgary's best walks
- Continue to work with the City of Calgary's mobility, roads and Main Streets departments on road improvements
- Continue to work with the Calgary police on areas of safety
- Continue to meet with the Councillor's office on mobility issues
- Continue to contribute to the Source newsletter
- Apply for a grant for the Paint the Pavement event
- Continue to learn with programs in the CDLI and the FCC

Annual Director Report - MLCA Preschool

Description of Committee: The MLCA Preschool is a cooperative, parent run program, led by a committee of dedicated parent volunteers who are responsible for the day-to day-operations. We currently run a 3-year-old program two days per week and a 4-year-old program three days per week from September until June. We also introduced a 4-year-old program that runs 5 days a week in the afternoons. The committee is made up of several volunteer roles that support the operation of the preschool.

Achievements:

We are a creative, play-based community preschool where children have the opportunity to learn through an environment that lays the foundation for future education. We promote peer-teacher-student relationships that develop children's self-esteem, self-awareness, social skills and for them to explore their environment and community.

The Preschool had a successful year last year. With our morning classes at capacity and good afternoon enrollment we were able to stay on budget. We had great interest in our Before and After care program. Our largest fundraiser of the year our Wine and Beer event raised over \$5000.00 and was very well attended. We had multiple other successful fundraisers which goes to show just how much support we have from the community.

As we continue into the 2024/2025 year we must continue to grow and change to meet the needs of our families in the community. We are proud to serve up to 72 students and their families in our community and could not run without the support of the MLCA, our teachers and volunteers from our community of families.

Annual Director Report - Seniors

Description of Committee:

- Organize activities for Senior 60+ who are residents of River Park, Altadore, Garrison Woods and South Calgary
- Arrange gatherings which are usually held every first Monday morning of each month and are intended to connect Seniors in the community for a morning of recreation, information and socializing. Attendance monthly varies between 20-45.
- Encourage participation of Seniors in physical fitness exercises and physical games such as pickleball, ping pong, yoga as well as mind games such as Scrabble, Mexican Rummy, Crib.
- Invite knitters and crafters in the group to assemble winter accessories to present to Rockyview Hospital during the holiday season.

Achievements:

- Monthly gatherings continue to be held (Jan-June, Sept-Dec) at the MLCA Hall, always starting at 9 a.m. with a 1-hour light fitness session followed by presentations by various subject matter experts and a social hour. Themes, topics covered and events held were as follow:
- Workshops: Cardiac Crash CPR (Heart & Stroke), Common scams targeting Seniors (Better Business Bureau), Personal estate planning (Bruni Law Marda Loop)
- Musical ballads and old ditties, singalongs
- Presentation on the Appalachian dulcimer by musician David Foster
- Celebrations of: Stampede and Thanksgiving
- Donations to: Calgary Food Bank (\$322 cash in silent pie auction)
- Mini sale/swap among members
- Pickleball every Tuesday and Friday between 9 am-12 noon: Indoors in Winter/Spring at Rosscarrock Community Association, Outdoors in Summer/Fall at Marda Loop Community Association

Annual Director Report - Sponsorship Committee

Description of Committee:

The Sponsorship Committee manages sponsorship efforts and supplies necessary tools and resources to support the collection of funds and the development of any agreements that are required. The committee is responsible for supporting the efforts of each committee to collect sponsorship in the form of general cash donations, event specific sponsorship, and sponsorship in kind (materials required to operate and host events). The committee is responsible for building an informed and committed relationship with the community and businesses that operate within the Marda Loop community.

Achievements:

- The 2023 Sponsorship Package was developed with input from Stampede Breakfast and Marketing Committees, and the General Manager. This package has been maintained and used to discuss opportunities with prospective sponsors.
- For the 2023 Stampede Breakfast we successfully raised \$14,000 in cash and \$3,000 in-kind sponsorships. Over 1,500 + people attended this event.
- For the 2023 Halloween Event we raised \$500 in cash and in-kind sponsorship. Approximately 100 to 120 kids are projected to attend this event.
- Kicking off initial sponsorship efforts for New Casino Night 2025!
- The Marda Loop business community has been amazing and incredibly supportive of all MLCA events. Without their support, we wouldn't be able to run all the events we do! It is greatly appreciated! Thank you so much!

Annual Director Report – Sustainability

Description of Committee:

- •Organizes community engagement and educational events to promote the 17 United Nations (UN) sustainable development goals and develops sustainable initiatives/action plans to address some of these goals within the MLCA community.
- Encourages energy conservation, use of renewable energy, minimal waste and offers support, training and recognition to local businesses and community residents for environmental and sustainable practices.

Achievements:

- Facilitated a workshop for MLCA residents with Green Calgary (Thursday March 14th) Part 2 Efficient Home Energy Consumption Residential Heat Pumps
- Coordinated a successful Community Clean Up event on Sunday, June 30th:
 - o raised over \$350 in donations
 - o collected ~18,600 kg of waste
 - o collected ~ 1275 kg of electronics with an estimated GHG emission savings
 - of ~ 1.2 Tonnes CO2e
 - o filled the WINs truck before noon
- Produced the 1st iteration of our Carbon Mitigation Plan
- Reviewed and estimated the MLCA solar electricity production and financial savings from our 2023 solar installation
